WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS UPDATE?

This document tells you how the QuayStreet Australian Equity Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

DESCRIPTION OF THIS FUND

The QuayStreet Australian Equity Fund invests predominantly in companies that are in the S&P/ASX 200 Total Return Index. The investment objective is to provide a level of return above the fund's benchmark over the long term.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS OF INVESTING?

Risk indicator for the QuayStreet Australian Equity Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

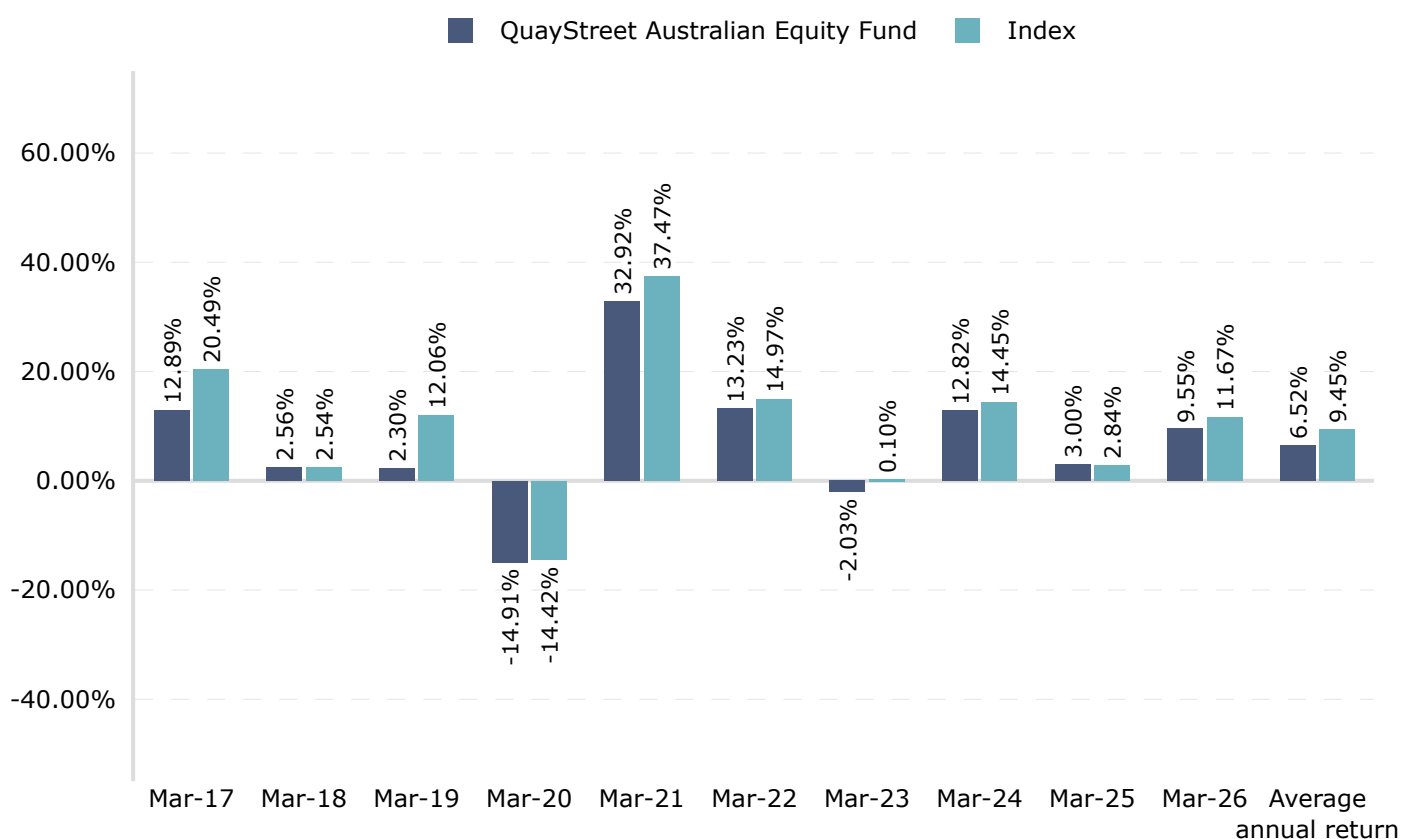

EXAMPLE OF HOW THIS APPLIES TO AN INVESTOR

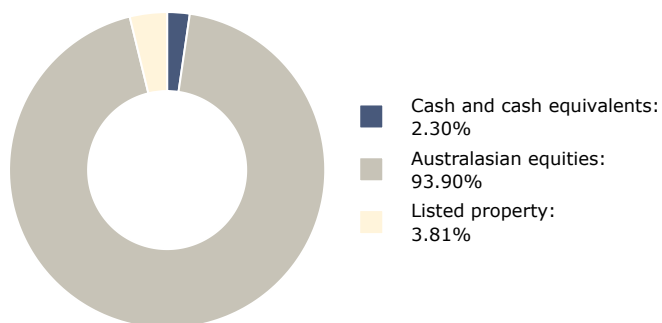
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Emma had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Emma received a return after fund charges were deducted but before tax of \$576 (that is 5.76% of Emma's initial \$10,000). This gives Emma a total return after tax of \$867 for the year.

Currency hedging

The fund's foreign currency exposure is actively managed in a manner consistent with the investment objectives and the performance benchmark of the fund. As at 30 June 2026, the fund's exposure to assets denominated in foreign currencies was 99.69%, of which 99.48% was hedged. This means the fund's unhedged foreign currency exposure was 0.52% of the net asset value of the fund.
